Sewing Squares Into Rows (12 of 16 videos) page3

... sure everything is nice and square. Notice I just push it in there, if I have problems with the feed dogs taking this up, I have this piece behind here, where I can use that to help pull it through. Because you are sewing through a number of thicknesses of fabric- there's the two thicknesses on this and then there are two more underneath. If you happen to catch some of that batting, that's even more thickness.

Now if you can see this fabric is starting to bunch up. So I am going to put my needle down, lift up my pressure foot, and I am going to re- adjust this fabric. I might want to put a pin in to help me re-distribute that fabric, just to make sure that it doesn't all get bunched up in all one area. If it does, that's okay, but it is nice to try re- adjust it like I just did. So let's get that needle down and I am going to push that over little. I am used to having a section on my machine where I can do that with my knee, but I took that off.

Okay, let's sew to the end. Coming to the end, I am going to take my little follower here and stick that down, so I can come off. And I am ready to go back.

Let's take one of these off to show you what it looks like. So that's been sewn together. There's a little bunching of fabric there, but you are not going to notice that so much, that's on the back. Let's open it up. The seam on the inside looks like this.
