

Disappearing 9-Patch Baby Quilt

Complete instructions for a 39" x 39" baby quilt

TIP! – I'VE ALSO INCLUDED AN EXTRA SQUARE OR TWO OF THE PRINT FABRIC, SO, IF DESIRED, YOU CAN CUT IN QUARTERS AFTER COMPLETING THE BABY SIZE QUILT. ATTACH TO 2 ½" WIDE STRIPS OF A BLENDING-NEUTRAL FABRIC YOU HAVE, THE LENGTH AND WIDTH OF THE TOP, THUS ADDING BORDERS & ENLARGING IT A LITTLE BIT. YOU'LL NEED A LITTLE BIGGER BATTING AND BACK TOO.

Kit includes:

45 squares 5" x 5" in a variety of prints
36 squares 5" x 5" in a variety of neutrals

You will need to add:

1 1/4 yards for backing (or more if adding border)
1/2 yard for binding
47" x 47" batting

Make the Disappearing 9-patch Block

Use a 1/4" seam and press the seam allowances to one side.

1. Arrange 5 print squares and 4 neutral squares in a 9-patch with the print squares in the corners and center.

2. Stitch the squares together. Your block should measure 14" x 14".



3. Cut the block in half horizontally and vertically (should be 7" squares)



4. Rotate 2 opposite corner pieces 180° as shown.



5. Stitch the squares together. Your block should measure 13 1/2" x 13 1/2" now. (when set in a quilt, finished block size is 13".)



6. Repeat Steps 1-5 to make 9 blocks

TIP! Arrange a few 9-patch blocks at a time on a design wall or table and replace squares as needed to create a variety of blocks. Keep in mind the center of each 9-patch will be cut into quarters, so mix up the center squares when making the 9-patch blocks..

Make the Quilt

1. Arrange the 9 blocks in 3 rows of 3 blocks on your design wall, or floor. Step back and move the blocks around until the arrangement pleases you.
2. Sew the blocks together into rows, and then sew the rows together.
3. If desired add corner squares & 2/5" strips to enlarge.
4. Layer the backing, batting, and your quilt top.
5. Baste and quilt with straight lines or a meander, as you wish.
6. Bind with your favorite method. (ASK ANN ABOUT THIS!!!!)

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
