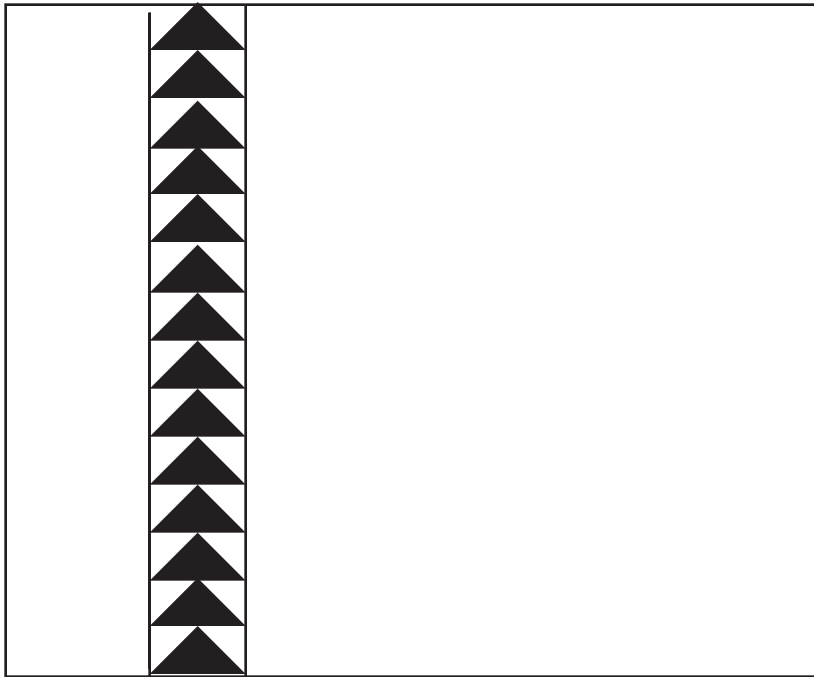


Flying Geese Summer Quilt

about 50" by 42"



FABRIC:

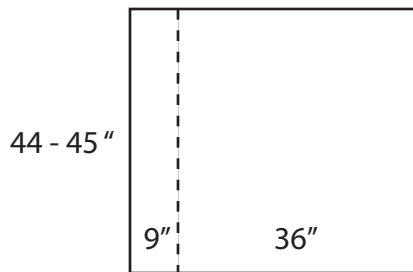
1 1/4 yards (top)

1 1/2 yards (back)

14 - 3"x 6" Flying Geese

DIRECTIONS:

- Selvage Edge - (1 1/4 yds)



- Selvage Edge -

Lay out your Geese. Sew fourteen 3 by 6" Flying Geese in a row. Press to the top.

Lay out your fabric. Trim the selvage edges. Cut a 9" by 42 1/2" strip. Cut a 36" by 42 1/2" rectangle.

Sew the left section to the Flying Geese strip. Press to the outside edge. Sew the right section to this unit. Press.

Cut your backing fabric the same size as your top (42 1/2" by 50 1/2")

Put right sides together and stitch about 3/8" around the outside edge.

Make sure to leave a 5" opening for turning. Turn and press.

Top stitch about 1/4" from the edge. I like to tie it every 4 to 5" but not necessary.



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
