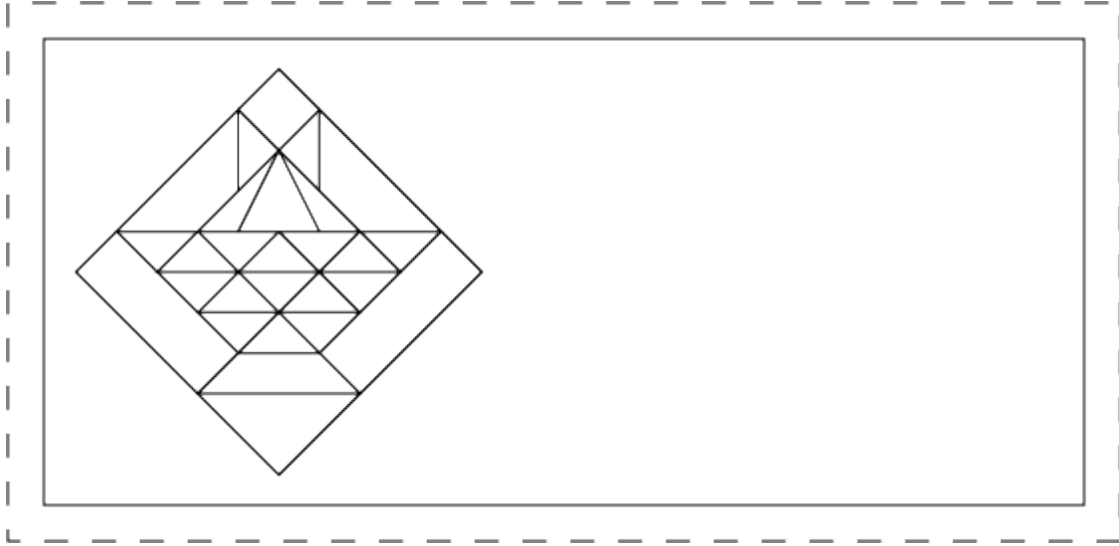


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Free Quilt Label



Many labels are done on muslin (cheap and plain fabric). Place muslin over this pattern and trace the lines. Use a permanent fabric marker. Write any information that you want on the label such as the quilt's maker, town, quilting design, etc. Pigma pens are good markers to use. You can find these in fabric shops and in art stores.

You can also print label this on your computer. You will need to cut a piece of freezer paper the size your computer paper (8 1/2" by 11"). The freezer paper is ironed to muslin cut the same size. This can be fed through your printer. If you have an ink jet printer make sure to only use the black ink. Set this with your iron. (Use a hot dry iron to "set" - keep the ink from washing out.)

Once you complete the label, it must be attached to the quilt. I often applique it to the back of the quilt.



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
