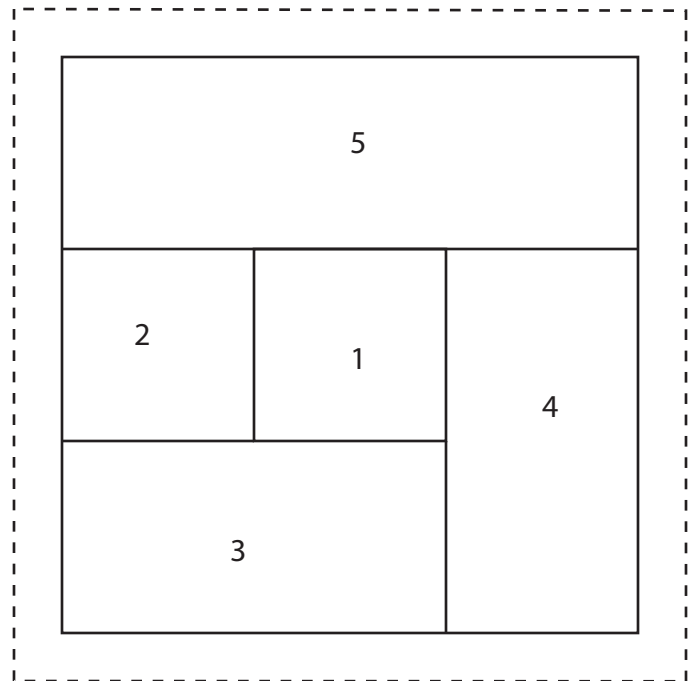
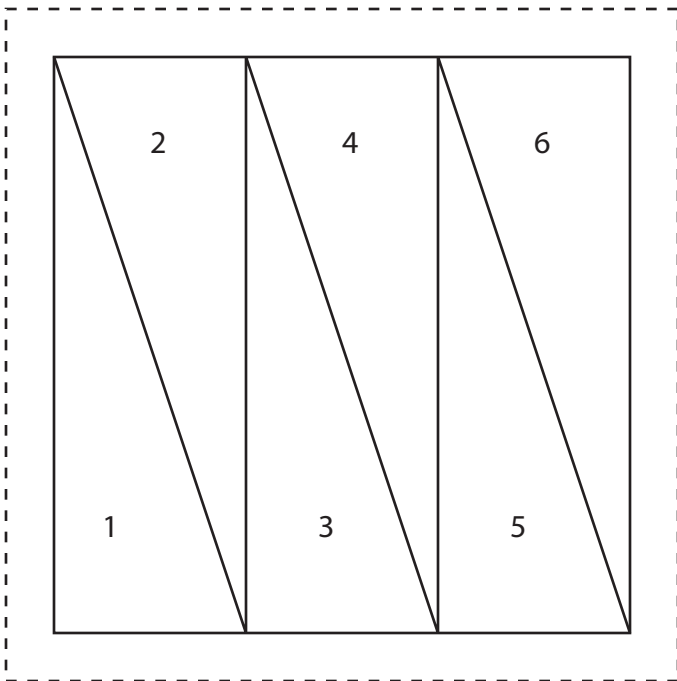
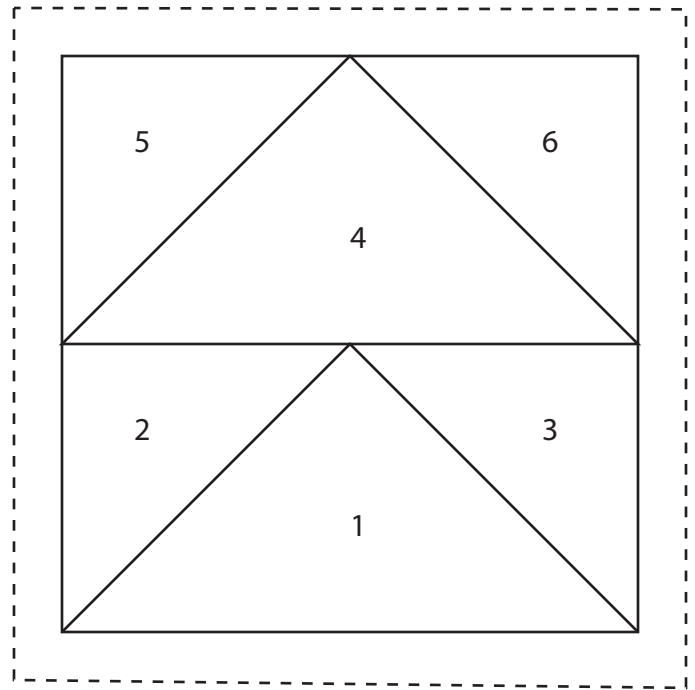
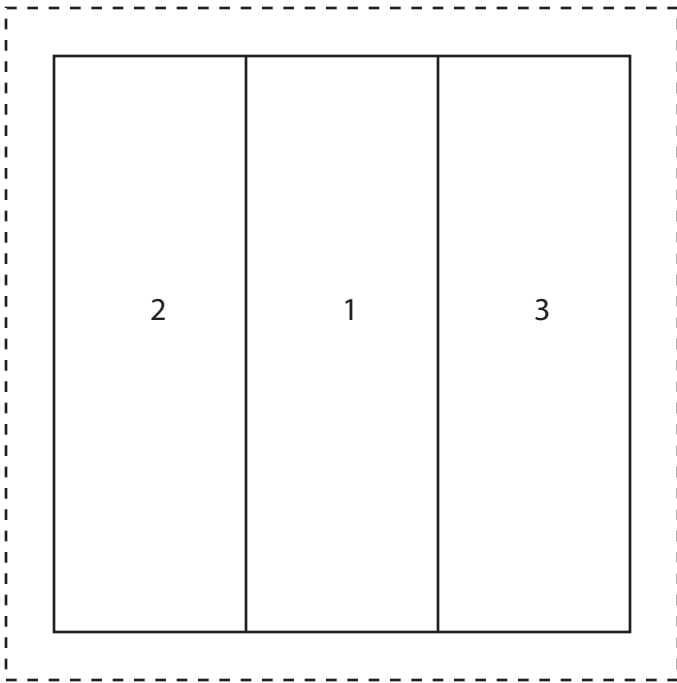


Paper Piecing Patterns - Originals



DIRECTIONS:

Start with neutral thread. Use a tight stitch length.

Make a crease on the line that you are going to sew.

Always sew on the side of the paper marked with the pattern. The fabric goes on the other side.

Fabric number 1 always goes right side up. (This is the only fabric that does not go right side down!)

Begin sewing 2 to 3 stitches before sewing line; end 2 to 3 stitches after the line.

Trim threads and seam and press after sewing a line. Fold paper back and forth to help with removal.

Make sure you cover the dashed line with fabric. Trim to this line when your block is complete.

Tear off paper (or keep if used for card or framing.) Use tweezers or seam ripper.



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
